ASHLAND HIGH SCHOOL 2018-2019 PROFILE

COMMUNITY: The City of Ashland, with a population of approximately 21,000, is the home of Southern Oregon University. Education and tourism, along with recreation, technology, and light manufacturing make up the community's economic base. Ashland's Oregon Shakespeare Festival attracts over 200,000 viewers each season.

SCHOOL: Ashland High School (AHS), accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (a division of AdvancEd), is a comprehensive, four-year high school of approximately 1,044 students with 59 teaching faculty. U.S. News and World Report has recognized AHS as a silver medal school every year since 2012. AHS follows a semester academic calendar with a block schedule that has four 92-minute classes meeting on alternate days. Post-secondary counseling occurs during senior year in our Career & College Readiness class. Each course has a value of one credit, with 50 credits required to graduate.
