Summer 2019 College Admissions Essay Writing Workshops.

(CAEW)

Our innovative Essay Writing Workshops consist of interactive class sessions, individual consultations, and mentored writing assignments. These integrated activities focus on the Writing Sections of the Common Application. Supplemental essays and short answer responses typically required by competitive private colleges, public universities, and scholarship programs will also be addressed.

Schedule:

The Summer 2019 CAEW Workshop at Ashland Library is structured around three intensive class sessions to be held on consecutive Sunday afternoons in the Guanajuato Room of the Library; **July 14, 21, and 28 from 12:30pm to 3:30pm.**

The Summer 2019 CAEW Workshop at Talent Library begins **July 29th** and meets **Mon/Wed mornings for two weeks.**

There will be in-class written work at each class session, as well as substantial weekly out-of-class assignments to be submitted online between each class session.

Attendance:

By attending all interactive sessions participants can take full advantage of the substantive information that will be offered on college admissions topics and receive individual assistance. However, all writing assignments and the basic information materials handed out at the class sessions will be available to participants online after each session.

Navigations2College was established by Ashland-based higher education consultant, Sarah Dickson Silver, M.A. The unique design of our Workshops is informed by her decades of work with non-profit youth education, by years of college teaching and course development, and through private practice as a college and career planning mentor.

The inspiration for this series of College Essay Writing Workshops owes much to the vibrant Oregon ASPIRE volunteer mentor program at Ashland High School. Net proceeds from CAEW tuition are donated to the Fast Forward Fund of the AHS ASPIRE program. The Fast Forward Fund assists low income students transitioning to college.

Statement of CAEW Goals

- 1) Each participant will have received essential information on the structure and required content of the **Common Application** and on how to research any of the 700 colleges and universities it serves.
- 2) Each participant will have created an individually authentic and well-written 500-650 word essay that meets the **Common Application** essay requirement **and/or** meets a typical essay requirement of a non-Common Application public university such as Oregon State.
- 3) Each participant will have developed a repertoire of appropriate and meaningful written responses to some of the most typical **supplemental writing requirements** of competitive colleges and universities.
- 4) Each participant will have completed a fully developed and intentionally arranged **Activities List** based on the Common Application requirement, along with a solid draft of a resume, such as may be required for some colleges and scholarship programs and for teacher/counselor recommendations.
- 5) Each participant will have gained **insight into the admissions processes** at our most popular in-state and WUE (*Western University Exchange*) colleges and universities.
- 6) Each participant will have opened a **Common Application account** and have entered substantive data and writing content prior to the start of school.

NOTE:

Participants who already know that they will need to address supplemental writings for a specific college, scholarship, or Honors program to which they plan to apply, will be encouraged to begin drafting these during the workshop period.

Registration Details:

- Tuition is on a Sliding Scale depending on family income level with Maximum Workshop Tuition of \$200.00.
- A non-refundable deposit is required to hold a seat.
- Each Workshop will enroll up to 16 participants.
- A waiting list will be maintained.
